PROJECT OVERVIEW

CONTEXT: Diocese of Pyay in Myanmar was established Jan. 6, 2023. Diocesan leaders seek to build a headquarter to serve the people in this new jurisdiction. It now shares space with St. Mark's Cathedral in Pyay, Myanmar, which limits diocesan activities. It is also far from the Pyay community that the diocese serves. Like many regions of Myanmar, those living in Pyay need to be reached with the Good News and discipled in their faith as many have not grown up in Christianity. The educational and community development training will help people grow in many ways.

NEED: Diocese of Pyay seeks to establish a base to provide a solid church experience for its members and the community. It needs a place to host weekly services, baptisms, marriages, and other functions. The facility will also allow the diocese to provide social-economic programs that help meet the needs of the community and congregants such as schools, conference facilities.

SOLUTION: With support by the Anglican Relief and Development Fund (ARDF), this project will allow the Diocese of Pyay to build a three-story, 7,920-square-foot building that will house diocesan offices, quest rooms, meeting rooms, and a conference hall that can be used for community development and training. It will also house a chapel and staff quarters.

LIFE IMPACT

Benefits 3,050 people, some in multiple ways:

- 2.500 current members of the diocese will have a new church home where they will be discipled and experience life together as a body of Christ.
- 50 new believers will be welcomed to the Christian faith in an open space and offered programs that help nurture their faith.
- 500 new people from the community will be able to access a church in their community. These are those who previously could not travel to the cathedral due to its distance from Pyay or those who are curious about the faith will be invited to explore its teachings.



WHAT IT'S LIKE NOW

PROJECT DESIGN

The 1,980-square-foot ground floor will house the diocesan staff guarters. The conference hall, office spaces, and a chapel will be on the next floor. A dormitory, guest room, and meeting rooms will be on the third floor. A multipurpose space will be on the roof top that can host various events.

Leaders of the Province of Myanmar will provide the Pyay Diocese with project oversight and an experienced project manager. Utilizing their experience with similar construction projects, the leaders can help form a building committee, deal with contractors, identify suitable engineers, and monitor progress. The work will be supervised by The Rt. Rev. Clement Sun Oo, Bishop, Diocese of Pyay, assisted by the Rev. Adam Myo Min Oo, General Secretary, Diocese of Pyay.

The diocese plans to mobilize its 2,500 members to give \$1 a month for 24 months. This will help raise \$60,000 for the project. With these funds, along with other donations from other Anglican churches, the diocese expects to build the foundation and first floor themselves. The other floors will be built with funding from ARDF and other funding agencies. The diocese will monitor closely to keep costs within budget, adjust expenses, and use volunteer labor — under the supervision of a professional contractor. The new building will provide space for pastoral care for the Pyay communities, including the celebration of the sacraments, promotion of spiritual growth, and assistance to those in need.

Education and faith formation programs are frequently prioritized by the diocese, which includes access to high schools, religious education programs, and opportunities for clergy, religious, and laity to continue their education. There will be student hostels, free tuition, and study tables, all of which encourage young people to commit to the work of the church.

Measuring impact. Once the facility opens, the diocese will track attendance at the church and the number of people attending events and conferences. In addition, fundraising goals will be monitored closely, and construction milestones will be monitored. A fully functioning building that is able to host more than 3,000 people on weekly basis in Pyay will be the mark of success of this investment.

INCOME: Donations and contributions stayed consistently in the upper 70% range for each year analyzed. Donations and contributions rose 11% from 2020 to 2021 and 77% from 2021 to 2022 mostly due to 55% increase in donations from parishes and a 77% increase in development project donations from the province for 2022. Other sources of income remained consistent.

EXPENSES: Donations was consistently the highest percentage of total expenses for all three years analyzed, followed closely by personnel (which includes pension expenses). Donations expense rose 92% from 2021 to 2022 mainly due to a 77% increase in development project expense consistent with the 77% increase in development project income.

CONCEPT: 1

This is a newly formed diocese that only received diocesan status in January 2023. It will serve the members of this diocese with education, training, and conferences that will be provided at the diocesan office building. This is the right time for the diocese to have its own building as it has recently achieved full diocesan status.

PROGRAM DESIGN & EXPERIENCE: 3

Diocese of Pyay will receive project support from the Province of Myanmar, which has experience with large construction projects, including those supported by ARDF. However, as this is construction in a new area, the location may provide its own unique challenges that could impact construction. The team has mapped out the construction schedule to minimize this risk and laid out clear deliverables.

LEADERSHIP: 1

Bishop Clement Sun Oo has been instrumental in the growth of the Diocese of Pyay. He has established 10 parishes and five church plants, including the church plant in Kyee-bin-kan village where members built their own worship place. He has also overseen the establishment of a hostel ministry, preschool ministry, and a potato chip business that subsidizes diocesan work. Under the bishop, the diocese has self-funded much of its work, even though most congregants are farmers.

FINANCIAL CONTROL: 3

The diocese has provided financial statements for 2020, 2021, and 2022. It has an operational budget of \$55,000 projected for its 2024 activities, which is significantly lower than the cost of this construction project. Accounting will be crucial for a project this size to keep income and expenditures well defined. If there is no funding or partial funding, the diocese will continue the project with its own resources and will extend the deadline, as needed.

SUSTAINABILITY: 1

There will be diocesan-wide fundraising to encourage every member to contribute and own this project.

Community members will be involved through financial contributions and prayers. The project has multiple sources of funding besides the amount requested from ARDF, which reduces overdependence on one source.

EXTERNAL: 3

The Pyay area is safe and far from the conflicts that occurred in 2021 that put the Karen communities at war. However, the nation continues to suffer political instability as recently as February 2021, when the Myanmar military, or Tatmadaw, successfully deposed the elected Myanmar government and formed a military junta. Such instability can impact even peaceful areas like Pyay.



LEADERSHIP PROFILES

The Rt. Rev. Clement Sun Oo serves as Bishop for the Diocese of Pyay. His background includes:

- a bachelor of arts degree in philosophy from Yangon University, Yangon, Myanmar
- a bachelor of theology degree from Holy Cross Theological College in Yangon
- master's degrees from Myanmar Institute of Theology, Insein, Yangon, and Trinity School for Ministries, Ambridge, Pennsylvania

The Rev. Adam Myo Min Oo will serve as the program leader. His background includes:

- a bachelor of arts degree in history from Pyay University
- a bachlor degree in theology from Holy Cross Theological College
- a master's of divinity degree from Myanmar Institute of Theology

Zin Zin Wah will serve as project manager. Her background includes:

- experience in community development
- experience in and knowledge of construction
