



## **Disaster Response Trip to Tennessee** **Frequently Asked Questions**

Q: What are the trip's **requirements**?

A: This is an adult mission trip so you must be at least 16 years old to volunteer with ARDF. Volunteers under 16 years old are permitted to work on the construction site but must always be supervised by a parent or legal guardian.

ARDF requires background checks on all volunteers. If you have not processed a background check in the past two years, you may apply for a background check through your home parish or the ARDF website. If you have processed a background check within the past two years, you may forward the "Pass" certificate to [tommy@ardf.org](mailto:tommy@ardf.org). In addition, you are to acknowledge that you have received your home parish's "Safeguarding Our Children" or "Safe Church Policy" training. The *Safe Church Acknowledgement Form, ARDF Activity Liability Waiver, and background check application*, may be found [here](#). There is a \$24 fee for the processing of your background check, payable to our service provider, Protect My Ministry.

Q: How much is the **registration fee**?

A: \$500. Register [here](#). This fee covers our partner's \$125 fee, meals, transportation while in Clarksville, tools, and administration costs. Because you are receiving goods and services, your fee does not qualify as a donation.

Q: What if I want to **donate** to ARDF's Domestic Disaster Network?

Q: Describe the mission **housing**?

A: Thankfully, Grace House and Clarksville Grace Church of the Nazarene were not in the direct path of the tornado. The mission housing sits on a beautiful property located next door to the church. We are utilizing the main floor of the home, which has 3 bunkrooms, 2 full bathrooms, living room, kitchen, and a large dining area. We can house up to 15 volunteers comfortably. Volunteers may choose to stay in an area hotel or bring an RV, at the missionary's expense. The ARDF fee still applies if alternative housing is preferred.

Q: Are there alternative accommodations, such as **hotels** or **RV parks**?

A: There are hotels in the area, as well as RV parks, which you may find on the internet. Be sure to check availability for your planned travel dates. The ARDF fee still applies if alternative housing is preferred.

Q: What is the closest **airport**? Is airport **transportation** available?

A: The closest major airport is Nashville International Airport (BNA), which is 57 miles from our base camp. If you would like transportation to and from the Nashville airport, please contact Tommy Lamb at [tommy@ardf.org](mailto:tommy@ardf.org).

Q: Which **meals** are provided?

A: Meals will be supplied by ARDF but must be prepared and served by volunteers in a fully equipped and functional kitchen at the base camp. Meals begin with Sunday dinner and end with Saturday breakfast. Lunch will be prepared in the morning at the base camp and eaten on the worksite. If you are interested in serving as a cook or kitchen helper, please [volunteer here](#). There will be opportunities to eat out as a group during the week, supporting local restaurants.

Q: Will there be an **orientation** on Sunday night?

A: Yes, please plan on arriving between 3:00 - 5:00 PM on Sunday. Dinner will be served at 5:00 PM followed by worship and a ministry orientation at 6:00 PM.

Q: What type of **construction** will we be doing?

A: We are currently doing repairs. This includes insulation, drywall, siding, windows and doors, floors, cabinets and vanities, trimming, painting, etc. We will give you more details on the status of the work within a week or two of your arrival.

Q: Are there **vehicles** available to get to the worksite?

A: If needed, ARDF will provide transportation to and from the worksites.

Q: Is **WIFI** available?

A: Yes, WIFI is available. You will be given the details when you arrive.

Q: Do you provide **bedding, linens, and towels**?

A: No, we do not. Please bring your bedding, linens or sleeping bag, pillow, and towels.

Q: Is there a **washing machine and dryer** available?

A: Yes, there is a washer and dryer available. It will not support multiple people doing multiple loads throughout the week so please plan accordingly.

Q: What is the daily **schedule**?

A: The approximate daily schedule is as follows:

6:30 - 7:45 AM	Breakfast, Devotion, & Announcements
7:45 - 12:00 PM	Worksite Ministry
12:00 - 1:00 PM	Worksite Lunch
1:00 - 3:45 PM	Worksite Ministry
3:45 - 4:00PM	Cleanup Worksite
4:00 - 6:00 PM	Free time
6:00 - 7:00 PM	Dinner
7:00 - 8:00 PM	Prayer & Debrief
9:00 PM	Lights Out

Q: Should we bring our own **PPE** and **tools**?

A. It is always a good idea to bring your own safety shoes, work gloves, safety glasses, face masks, and personal protection equipment (PPE). We have stocked tool trailers, but for those of you who prefer to use your own, feel free to bring what you'd like. If you are flying, please check TSA restrictions.

Q: Are there **volunteer opportunities** other than construction?

A: Yes, spiritual care, meal preparation, serving, debris clean up...there is something for everyone!

Q: Do you have **tee shirts** for this mission?

A: Yes, one ARDF Disaster Response tee and one Disaster ReBuilders tee will be provided and given out during orientation. Please be sure to include your tee shirt size upon registration [here](#).
